Paper 3: Speaking

Tip

The Speaking test takes between 8 and 10 minutes. You take it with a partner. There will be two examiners – one of them will just listen to you. The other will ask you and your partner questions, and then will ask you to do a task together.

PART 1

This part of the test takes 5–6 minutes. The examiner will ask you and your partner questions about yourselves, your school, your daily life and your activities in your free time.

PART 2 Cards 1–8 (pages 76–83)

This part of the test takes 3–4 minutes. The examiner will ask you and your partner to talk to each other, using some cards to help you.

The examiner will give you a card with some information on it. Your partner will get a card with some prompts on it. Your partner will make five questions using the prompts on the card. You must answer the questions using the information on the card. Then you will change over. The examiner will give you and your partner two different cards. This time you will ask five questions and your partner will answer them.

Remember, you can ask the examiner or your partner to repeat anything you do not understand.
