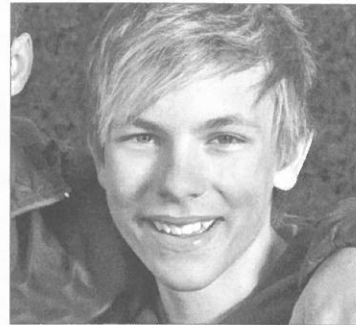

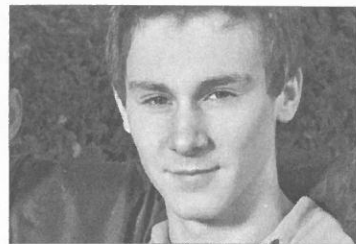
Dave

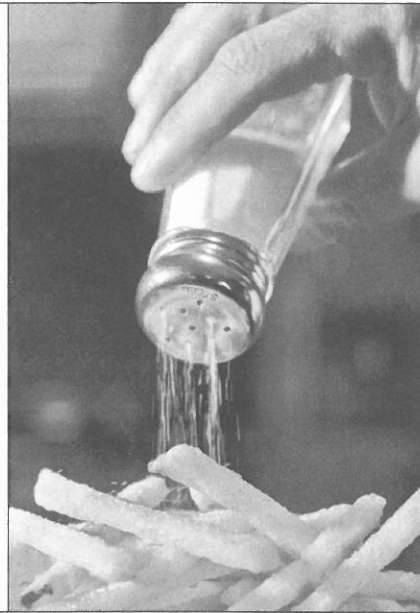
