

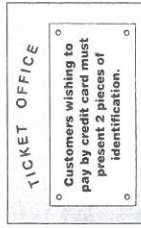
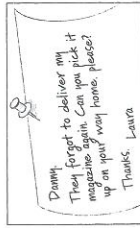
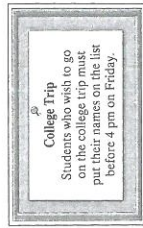

## SEA FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

**What is SEA?**  
SEA stands for Sporting Equipment Auction. Have you ever decided to try a sport, bought all the equipment, and then decided that it was not for you? Or perhaps you've become so good at a sport that you need new, more professional equipment. The SEA website brings buyers and sellers together. It's the perfect online marketplace for buying and selling used sporting equipment: from tennis balls to scuba-diving gear.

**I want to sell something. How do I get started?**  
Simple! You'll need to register first to become a 'registered user'. Just fill in a few simple details, such as name, address, telephone number and e-mail address, and that's all there is to it!

**How can I place an item up for sale?**  
Log on to your seller's web page, using your registration name and password. Click 'Place Item Up for Sale' and follow the step-by-step instructions. After you enter the required information, your auction can begin. The item will appear for 7 days.

**How does an auction work?**  
People who want to buy an item make offers (or 'bids') on the seller's web page. At the end of the 7 days, the highest bidder wins the item. A seller can also set an 'End Auction Now' price. This means that a buyer can buy the item for the price the seller sets, instead of waiting for the auction to end.

**Do I have to register to buy things?**  
You don't have to register to buy from SEA, but non-registered buyers can only buy items worth up to £10. Registration costs nothing and is quick and easy. Most sellers prefer you to pay by debit card. You must e-mail the buyer if you want to pay in any other way.

**How do I get the things I buy?**  
If you buy an item, the seller will send you an e-mail with delivery details. Most items within the UK are delivered for a standard postage charge of £1.50. Overseas deliveries cost more, depending on where the buyer lives. If you live near a seller, you can save on postage costs by arranging to collect the item yourself. If you are buying clothing, please make sure you use the right size. If you need to return an item because you don't like it, you must pay the postage cost yourself. **What if I change my mind about buying something?**  
You have 3 days to change your mind after a seller accepts your bid. If you change your mind, you must pay the seller a 'Remove Bid' fee of £5.
