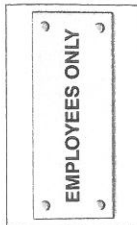

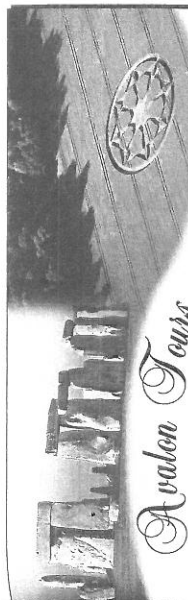

Glastonbury, the legendary Isle of Avalon, has been attracting visitors from all over the world for hundreds of years. It has long been at the centre of the legend of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table. In 1191, a cross with the words 'Here lies buried the renowned King Arthur in the Isle of Avalon' was found below Glastonbury Abbey.

Glastonbury Abbey is also well known as the birthplace of Christianity in Britain. Local legend says that Joseph of Arimathea founded the abbey, after buying the 'Chalice', or cup used by Jesus at the Last Supper, under nearby Chalice Well.

No visit to the area would be complete without visiting Glastonbury Tor, a strange, pyramid-shaped hill where you can see the remains of an ancient labyrinth. Images of the labyrinth can be seen on coins from ancient Crete, on columns at Pompeii and among the Hopi Indians of Arizona.

But perhaps the most famous place in this area is Stonehenge. Standing alone on Salisbury Plain,

Stonehenge is the best known of all stone circles. The history of Stonehenge remains a mystery, although some archaeologists think that the monument at Stonehenge may have been an ancient calendar. Also in this area is Avebury Henge, which is thought not so well known as Stonehenge, is the largest stone circle in the world.

You can also learn about a more recent event at 'The River Severn Tsumami' exhibition. The exhibition contains documents, drawings and other exhibits from 1687, when what is now thought to be a tsunami hit the coast, killing about 100 people and changing the surrounding countryside forever.

Even more recent is the appearance of strange patterns in fields, particularly in the Avebury area. Some people believe that they are made by aliens. Whatever your opinion, when you see them, you'll have to admit that they are truly beautiful creations.
