Captain Kidd

The famous pirate Captain Kidd was born (0) ... Scotland in the middle of the seventeenth century. As a young man he was employed (16) ... the English as a "privateer", or commander of a privately-owned armed ship, to attack enemy ships in the West Indies. (17) ... the age of 45, he left England and moved to New York. (18) ... he married and became a respectable, wealthy sea captain. But Kidd soon (19) ... tired of this type of life and returned to England, where the king asked (20) ... to take command of the ship Adventure Galley and sail to the Indian Ocean in (21) ... to capture pirate ships. Kidd willingly agreed, and set (22) ... almost immediately. (23) ... his arrival in the Indian Ocean, he attacked several merchant ships taking their cargo and gradually amassing a huge fortune of treasure. (24) ... of these ships belonged to France, which at the (25) ... was at war with England, so they were regarded as prizes of war. However, Kidd (26) ... attacked ships belonging to countries that were friendly to England. When this became known in England, Kidd was declared a pirate, although Kidd did (27) ... find this out until he got to the West Indies. There, finding that he (28) ... become a wanted man, Kidd quickly sold most of his cargo and returned to America. He thought he (29) ... be safe there, but he (30) ... soon arrested and taken to England for trial. He was found guilty of piracy and hanged.
