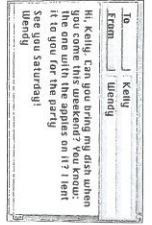

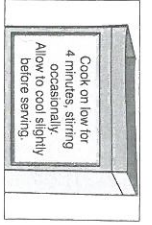

**Conway Castle**
